A MESSAGE FROM OUR YOUTH MINISTER

Last weekend, I had the privilege to take our youth group (and incredible chaperones) down to Gatlinburg for Winterfest. If you don't know, Winterfest is a conference that roughly 10,000 teens attend with one common thing on their minds and that's Jesus. As a teenager this was always one of the highlights of my year. You get to go meet new people from all over the country, explore a new town, and praise God in an overwhelmingly pure atmosphere.

The theme of this year was Identity (Who Are You?). The weekend was full of lessons and examples that showed, no matter what the world says, that our identity is in God. Over and over throughout the weekend, a video would play between activities or speakers with the theme that we are CHOSEN by God. Each speaker was assigned a different section of 1 Peter 2:9-10 to talk about. As we got there Friday night, we learned about how we are a chosen people. David Skidmore did an excellent job of relating the idea of being chosen to kids choosing their identity in a school lunchroom. Saturday morning we heard from Jeff and Taylor Walling about how we are a royal priesthood, set apart from the world but here to steer it towards God. That evening, David Fraze showed us why we should think of ourselves as a holy nation because of what Jesus has done for us. As we prepared to leave on Sunday morning, Mike Cope blessed us with a lesson about being God's special possession.

This was my first time being at Winterfest as an adult, not as a teenager. I had to be the responsible one, which in itself is scary. As an adult, I had a totally different perspective of the weekend. As amazing as the lessons, singing, and atmosphere were, that's not what stuck out to me. What stuck out to me was watching our youth group throughout the weekend and seeing how captivated they were the entire time. Seeing these kids that I'm getting to watch grow up and go through life, watching them learn about Jesus in a place that seems separate from the world and taking it back with them into the world was so special for me. When I got home, I was a little sad to be back. I didn't want to be home yet. I still wanted to be there in that atmosphere, that safe space. I was talking to my dad about that and he said he goes through that every time he goes to Winterfest. Then, he said something that has been with me every day since. "Take that weekend with you and make a difference where you are. Peace is not in those big events. Peace is in that everyday connection with God, no matter where you are." My prayer is that our youth has done just that. That they take what they learned and experienced that weekend into their own world and share it with their friends. That has been the same prayer for myself as well, that I can take what I leaned and experienced into my world and share Jesus everywhere.
