CREATED IN GOD'S IMAGE

For my Bible reading plan this year I am working through the Bible Project, again. I really liked the breakdown of the readings for each day and the order in which the readings were taken. Last year I read through this schedule using the English Standard Version. I decided I would read through the New International Version this year. Today's reading includes the 8th Psalm.

As I was traveling into work yesterday morning, I couldn't help but notice the beauty of the sky as the sun was rising. Specifically, as I came into Charleston, the sky over the dome of the capitol building had beautiful shades of blue, red, and purple. I know the old saying says, "Red sky at night, sailor's delight. Red sky in morning, sailor's warning." But, I didn't have any plans to go sailing, so I wasn't worried. Instead, I was drawn into the beauty of God's creation. I couldn't help but be inspired by the fact that God would care so much for His creation that He would actually go the extra mile to create it to display beauty.

God's creation is immense. Both the size and the detail that God has put into His creation is unfathomable. And yet, God has placed great care into everything He has created.

As I read through Psalm 8 today, I couldn't help to reflect on that scene from my drive in yesterday. David said in (Psalm 8:3-5), "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor."

When God created, He created with great care, precision, and beauty. When you see that beauty, you can know that God cares for His creation. But sometimes we might be tempted to feel like an insignificant speck in light of how great His creation is. But when we look at each other and we look in the mirror and see His creation of mankind, we can be certain that God has created us with great precision and beauty, as well. We can be certain that God cares for us, too. We can know this because God created mankind with the greatest care and beauty. He created us to bear His image.

"Then God said, 'Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground.' So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." - (Genesis 1:26-27)

God cares for His creation. He cares for us. We are not insignificant. I am not insignificant. You are not insignificant. We are the beautifully created image bearers of God!
