A LITTLE EXTRA EFFORT

I went rock climbing for the first time this week. My boss goes a few times a week and invited me along, so I figured why not. I soon discovered that it would not be my last time there. I loved every minute of it. It was a new challenge. It works muscles and parts of your body that you forget even exist. I quickly learned the easier lines up the wall and could climb them without a problem. Then, I moved onto the next difficulty of lines. Not so easy. As I watched the experienced climbers scale up that line effortlessly, I kept thinking "that looks easy enough." I must have tried that line 15 times and never achieved it. I tried over and over, falling to the floor time and time again, but I never got discouraged about it. Instead, I kept getting more and more determined to overcome that challenge. As I failed the last time, my boss told me not to worry because the more I come the easier it will get.

As I was driving home I thought to myself, what if I tried as hard to be like Jesus as I did to climb that wall? What if each time I failed, it made me get up more determined than before rather than to give up? As Christians, it's much easier to just give up when the world shows us how hard it is to follow Jesus. When Satan knocks us down, it's a lot easier to stay down than to get up and fight back. However, each time we get back up it gets easier and it gets harder for Satan to knock us back down. When I finally climb to the top of that wall and defeat that challenge, it will be a great feeling of accomplishment. But that feeling is nothing compared to when we defeat Satan. The feeling of getting to the top of that wall cannot even begin to describe the feeling when we stand at the gates of Heaven. If we take even half the effort that we put towards receiving worldly goals and put that towards striving to be like Jesus, we would be absolutely shocked at the difference we would make in the world as a church.
